

The kitchen is the heart of the home. When it becomes dark, dated, and cramped, it can affect the entire house, and the entire family.






This mid-century modern deck house was in need of an update in order to make it more functional for its owners and to allow the home to shine in the way that it deserved. Although the kitchen itself had a lot of windows because of its mid-century modern style, it still managed to look dark and cramped with its poor layout and cramped design.

Appliance usage was difficult in the small space, and there were very few options for storage, which led to many items being kept on the cluttered countertops. The homeowners wanted to stay with the style of the home, while connecting the rest of the main floor living area to the kitchen and redesigning the entire space to better suit the everyday needs of the family.

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The existing dining room and kitchen swapped places to allow for a better flow, and lighting was improved to really brighten the space and make it feel more open. Mid-century modern features were implemented throughout to keep with the style of the home, as well as some more traditional elements to please the style of one of the homeowners.





By the end of the project, the new kitchen and dining area became the shining center of the home, creating a space that is more beautiful and functional for the entire family.

THE MITCHELL KITCHEN

Chicken Marsala (two servings)

ingredients

- Large Chicken Breast
- Flour (as needed to dredge)
- Salt tsp. salt
- **Pepper** cup shortening
- Onion Powder cup peanut butter
- Garlic Powder cup sugar
- Olive Oil cup brown sugar
- 1¹/₂ cups of Mushrooms
- I cup of Marsala Wine
- **2** tbsp. of Lemon Juice
- 2 cloves of Garlic (minced)
- I tbsp. of Butter
- I tbsp. of Parsley

instructions

- I. Butterfly, pound, and divide one large chicken breast into two pieces
- **2.** Combine flour, salt, pepper, onion powder, and garlic powder and dredge chicken breast in seasoned flour then dust off any excess
- **3.** Fry the chicken in a little bit of olive oil on a hot pan, until golden brown on each side or cooked through to 165 degrees. Remove from pan.
- In the same pan, add the mushrooms and cook until soft
- Once mushrooms are soft add in the marsala wine, lemon juiced, minced garlic, butter, and parsley. Let this cook on medium heat until thickened
- **6.** Serve chicken with pasta, rice, or alone with the sauce spooned on top
